I Timothy 2:1-3, I urge you, first of all, to pray for all people. ² "There was a judge in a certain city," he said, "who was a godless man with great contempt for everyone. ³A widow of that city came to him repeatedly, appealing for justice against someone who had harmed her. ⁴ The judge ignored her for a while, but eventually she wore him out. 'I fear neither God nor man,' he said to himself, 5 'but this woman is driving me crazy. I'm going to see that she gets justice, because she is wearing me out with her constant requests!" ⁶ Then the Lord said, "Learn a lesson from this evil judge. ⁷ Even he rendered a just decision in the end, so don't you think God will surely give justice to his chosen people who plead with him day and night?
